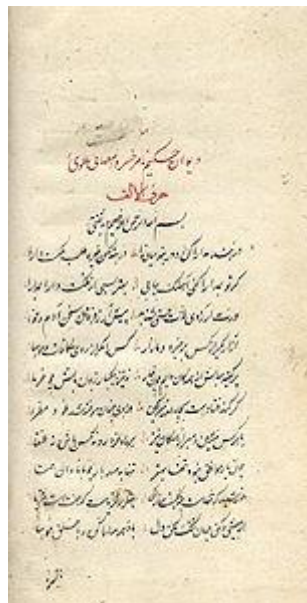




Divan-i Nasir Khusraw



 The prominent eleventh century Ismaili *da'i* [1] [Nasir Khusraw](#) [2] is acknowledged as one of the foremost poets of the Persian language. It was in the valley of Yumgan, a remote mountainous region of Badakhshan, that [Nasir Khusraw](#) [2] composed most of his works, all of which are written in Persian. The [Divan](#)  [3], a collection of his poetry, includes close to 11,000 verses on personal, ethical and religious themes. This manuscript, written in clear *nasta'liq* hand, is preceded by a short autobiographical account of the poet.
